**Principal Roles** 

Ali Baba
Principal Boy (male or female). Hero of the story. Sings some solos / duets.
Ali's mother (panto dame – played by a man) – forceful personality.
Salma
Principal Girl. Heroine of the story. Ali and Fellah's servant. Sings 2 duets.
Fairly active character, "larger than life". Good singer required.

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The above four characters all interact with the audience quite frequently.

**Princess Amirah** Young and bossy – Ali wants to marry her.

**Sultan Bin Roolin** Princess Amirah's father

**Hoo Wazir** The Sultan's Chief Minister. Villain of the story.

**Jabbar** Leader of the thieves (used to be a pirate and needs to speak piratically).

**Toot &** A pair of thieves – the comic duo – lots of goofing about.

**Fayha** The pantomime camel - one person is the front half & another is the back half

(non-speaking role)

#### Chorus

**Thieves** At least six required (one very short) – a few speaking lines & group singing

Wakil or Ruqayyah The snake charmer (a few speaking lines)
SatNav The voice of the Camel (probably pre-recorded)

**Extras** Citizens, traders, Sultan's guards

A mixture of non-speaking roles, some roles with a few speaking lines, group singing, and some dancing roles may be available.

#### Character Descriptions

**Ali:** Principal Boy. Hero. Optimistic, impulsive, good-hearted. A bit of a dreamer, given to speech and action before careful thought.

**Salma:** Ali and Fellah's servant. Very resourceful. Pretty, shy, enthusiastic but subservient. Needs to win the hearts of the audience.

**Fellah:** Dame. Ali's Mother. A widow trying to attract men. Comically greedy, vain and self-important.

**Hoo Wazir:** Female villain. Pompous, self-important, vaguely threatening. **Sultan:** Stern but fair. If it's possible to be a benign tyrant, then he is it.

**Princess:** Beautiful and knows it! Self-obsessed; thinks that the world revolves around her which, at court, is probably true.

**Genie:** Larger than life, fills the stage with his presence. The epitome of magical cool. Doing magic for other people appears to be beneath his dignity. In view of his first entrance, needs to be supple!

**Jabbar:** Leader of the thieves. A former pirate, turned to land-based robbery. Speaks the language of Bristol Pirate.

**Toot / Carmen**: Pair of low-ranking thieves. Their enthusiasm exceeds their confidence. They are eager to please, but clumsy. Whilst the rest of the thieves were originally pirates, Toot and Carmen only joined them on land. As a result, they are attempting to speak Pirate but from a background of middle-eastern loquaciousness.

**SatNav:** The SatNav should speak in the manner of a machine assembling phrases from a dictionary of recorded words - thus the emphasis should be in the wrong places.

#### Synopsis – OR What's It All About?

Ali Baba falls for the Sultan's daughter and determines to impress her by retrieving valuables stolen by a band of thieves. Unfortunately, the thieves have other ideas. Ali has Salma, the resourceful servant girl, a Genie, a camel with integral SatNav, and, of course, his mother to call on, but what he really needs is an audience to help him win through!

Ali Baba and the Forty Thieves is a British pantomime with magic, spectacle, music, visual jokes, slapstick and verbal humour. Pantomimes are traditionally staged around Christmas, when the English professional theatre actors are off season/not so busy and need some extra cash! The pantomime grew out of the old music hall tradition, adapted for family viewing – as a result there are some jokes which have double meanings (which means the older members of the audience may laugh at different things sometimes). Some characters are traditionally played out of gender to heighten the comic impact.

For anyone concerned about how that fits in a modern LGBTQ-aware society here is an interesting defence of the role of the pantomime dame in modern society by Grayson Perry in The Guardian. He says, "Cross-dressing undermines the increasingly rigid gender roles that are pushed on our children. Being in drag has a comedic bent. It means you can perhaps edge into darker territory, without causing serious offence. And that's part of the role of the panto dame, to be genuinely outrageous, and the best pantos always weave in the socio-politics of the day. They can be very topical, very sharp. It's the honest fool thing; that's part of what it's about."

#### So What Do I Do At An Audition – And Who Can Take Part?

We are looking for **people of all ages and experience** – whether you have ever been on stage before or not it doesn't matter – there is something for everyone.

We are **family inclusive** - if anyone under the age of 16 would like to take part that's fine as long as an older family member or caregiver will *also* be in the show.

For the audition we will do some group singing to warm up our voices, then the people auditioning for a principal singing role will sing something on their own to show us how strong their voices are. For those who want a speaking role we'll also try reading out loud some parts of the show. If reading is not your thing, then please prepare a short poem or a monologue so you can recite it from memory. We want to find out how strong and confident your voice sounds because the people watching the show need to be able to hear you ②.

Just fill in the form at the end of this pack and bring it with you to the Warkworth Town Hall on Thursday 25<sup>th</sup> August at 7pm, or Sunday 28<sup>th</sup> August at 10am (you don't need to come to both, although you are welcome to join us again if you want).

#### Going On Stage Is Not My Thing – What Else Could I Do?

We also have lots of things that need doing to make the production happen – there will be teams working on the scenery construction (designing, building and painting large and small items), props (finding or making the things carried on and off stage by the actors), costumes (sewing/altering). We also need people to help backstage during the performances (mainly moving things on and off) and out the front (ushering, selling food & drinks etc.) We'd love to have your help!

#### What Happens After The Auditions

If you have auditioned for a speaking role, we'll call you within the week to let you know if we've been able to match you to a part. It is likely that everyone who auditions will be in the cast as it is quite a flexible-sized production. We'll have a read through with everyone on Sunday 11<sup>th</sup> September in the Mezzanine Room (upstairs at the Town Hall, where some of our rehearsals will also take place).

Most of our chorus and whole group practices will take place at rehearsals on Sundays from 10am to 1pm. The principal characters will also rehearse on a Tuesday and/or Thursday, depending on which scenes they are involved in and nearer the performance time more cast will have to do some evening rehearsals. The rehearsal schedule and performance dates are below – you need to be able to commit to the dates – we're a team and we rely on each other being there. **Talk to the director if you are not sure of your availability on any of the dates listed.**
